

AMERICA'S FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. The Society assumes no responsibility in case of loss or damage and, upon this condition only, entries are accepted. The Society reserves the right to reject any or all entries.
2. Each exhibitor is expected to project an accurate, responsible and courteous message about agriculture, animal care and management and the related industry. Every opportunity should be taken to enhance public awareness and education of proper livestock management and handling practices. There will be no tolerance for exhibitors who do not comply with this requirement.
3. All animals and articles for exhibition must remain on the grounds according to the rules of each department, or forfeit their premium unless excused by the Fair Manager of the Society.
4. Any person making false entry shall forfeit any award on such entry.
5. All premium checks not cashed by November 30th of the current year shall be forfeited to the Society.
6. All protests must be in writing and filed with the Fair Manager before 10:00 AM of the last day of the Fair.
7. Exhibitors under 19 years of age staying on the grounds overnight will be governed strictly by the rules and regulations of the 4-H Section D & E.
8. All persons violating the above rules shall be subject to ejection from the Fairgrounds or property of the Erie County Agricultural Society at Hamburg, New York, and shall also be subject to such other penalties as may be provided by the law for any and all offenses committed by such persons in violation of the law.
9. **All exhibitors must abide by the International Association of Fairs and Exposition National Code of Show Ring Ethics & dairy cattle exhibitors must abide by the Dairy Cattle Show Ring Code of Ethics.**
